Principles of Islamic jurisprudence, also known as *uṣūl al-fiqh* ( Arabic: *هـ ق ف ل ا ل و ص ا* , lit. roots of fiqh), are traditional methodological principles used in Islamic jurisprudence ( *fiqh*) for deriving the rulings of Islamic law ( *sharia* ). Traditional theory of Islamic jurisprudence elaborates how the scriptures ( Quran and hadith) should be interpreted from the standpoint of linguistics and rhetoric.

## **What Are Sources of Islamic Law (Sharia)?**

The emergence of Ottoman dynastic law in the form of kânûn and what he refers to, without closer definition, as a specific 'branch' of Ḥanafī law, are examples of the tendency.
