Hepatic encephalopathy is a complication of liver disease that occurs when blood flow bypasses the liver (called portal hypertension) and enters into the rest of the circulation. This unfiltered blood carries toxins that enter

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the brain and affects normal function.

Hepatic encephalopathy can occur in those with acute or chronic liver disease. Episodes can be triggered by infections, GI bleeding, constipation, electrolyte problems, or certain medications. There isn't a standard test to check for hepatic encephalopathy. However, blood tests can identify problems such as infections and bleeding associated with liver disease. Your doctor may order other tests to rule out conditions that cause similar symptoms, such as strokes and brain tumors.
